



OPEN LETTER TO KEVIN MCCARTHY LEADER OF THE HOUSE REPUBLICANS

February 15, 2022

Dear House Leader McCarthy:

Please find a copy of my letter to Governor Ron DeSantis and President of the Florida Supervisors of Elections Wesley Wilcox concerning the suppression of information and discourse on the constitutionality of the 2020 Presidential Election in my primary race against Congresswoman Kat Cammack in Florida's 3rd congressional district. This primary campaign is unique in the nation. It is the only one in the nation dealing with our Republican Party's policy toward the US Judicial Conference and the laws that protect our Constitution from the subversion of justice.

I assume that you are familiar with my [Consideration](#) of parental power that is pending before the US Judicial Conference, my action under the Judicial Conduct Act of 1980, and the criminal indifference to civil rights action that underly my Consideration. Thus, I assume that you are clearly understanding my motives to run against Kat and see how my Consideration is related to the constitutionality of the 2020 Presidential Election. Both the Consideration and the Election cases are a subversion of justice at the US Judicial Conference matters. Congress must review my Consideration—not the US courts or the US Judicial Conference. This also happens to be the case with the election matter.

I learnt about you having privately charged, tried, convicted, and sentenced former US Congressman Ted Yoho of the 3rd for having used vulgar language to intensity his displeasure with US Congresswoman Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez (AOC) soon after the incidence was reported.
